Campaign Integrity Contract

During my campaign I will abide by the following guidelines:

- -I will not use inappropriate language and images during my campaign.
- -I will not deface or remove any other candidate's campaign materials.
- -I will behave with dignity, integrity, and respect towards my opponents.
- -I will conduct myself with maturity and honesty throughout my campaign.
- -I understand that I am responsible for the actions of my personal supporters and campaign helpers.
- -I will accept the results of the election with maturity and respect.

I understand that if I do not abide by these guidelines that my candidacy may be subject to review.

Campaign Rules

General Criteria:

- Appropriate language, free of putdowns, negative innuendos, and profanity, is to be used on all of your campaign materials.
- YOU must take down, posters and banners at the LATEST, Friday, May 25 at 8:00 A.M.
- Materials may **only** be hung in the Middle School hallway, cafeteria on windows, and also in teacher classrooms with their permission with **painters tape** only.
- Handouts including, but not limited to, fliers (no larger than regular paper size 8.5 x 11), pamphlets, stickers, and buttons may be used with the understanding that damages to school property must be cleaned/removed at the expense of the candidate. **No candy allowed**.

Poster/Banner Criteria:

- No more than 5 posters and 1 banner.
- Each poster must be no larger than 2' x 3' -a combined total of this size may be used for 1 or 2 large posters of combined measurements.
- Banners must be no larger than 3' x 7'

Speeches:

• Live speeches will be held in the cafeteria and cannot be longer than one minute.

*Failure to follow these guidelines may result in one's candidacy being reviewed.

Franklin Academy Student Council Responsibilities Contract

- 1. I will be an exemplary student and citizen through my conduct and academic studies. This is a full time commitment for the entire term of office (May 29th, 2018-May 29th, 2019).
- 2. I understand that any suspension from school will cause for my immediate dismissal from my Student Council position, unless an administrator overrules this.
- 3. I will attend the Student Council meetings for the entire year I am in office. If I am unable to be a member at the meetings, I will forfeit my position.
- 4. I will be in attendance for required Student Council activities, and understand that I will receive demerits if I am unable to attend.
- 5. I will maintain a GPA of 3.0 or above.
- 6. I will need, at times, to be available before and after school, and on non-school days.
- 7. I will show and have respect for others and myself at all times. I will remember who I am and who I represent Franklin Academy and Student Council.
- 8. I understand and accept that Franklin Academy faculty members shall monitor the election results and those decisions will be final.
- 9. I have read and understand the Franklin Academy Student Council Constitution.
- 10. I understand that if elected/selected, I may receive demerits for various reasons (failure to turn in money in a timely manner, inappropriate behavior, failure to attend Student Council functions, etc.) and that earning 16 demerits will result in probation; 18 results in removal from the organization.
- 11. I understand that I may be asked to leave campus on Student Council-related errands or field trips, and pledge to behave responsibly, reflecting the best of Student Council, school and myself.
- 12. I understand that I will be working with equipment and supplies and will be held responsible for any damage and/or waste due to negligence.
- 13. I understand that if I am going to be absent, I need to inform the advisor **prior to the meeting time** and failure to do so may result in demerits.
- 14. I understand that I will be responsible for participating in various fund-raising activities and that I am responsible for turning in all monies in a timely manner.
- 15. I understand that I will be expected to pay Student Council dues in the amount of \$100 by the first meeting in September 2018 (or make a payment if a payment plan is needed). I understand that these dues will go towards my Student Council polo and other miscellaneous Student Council-related expenses.
